

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| <p><b>EXOSPHERE</b></p> <p><b>EXOBASE</b></p> <p>600-10,000 KM/375-6,200 MI</p> <p>The exosphere is the uppermost layer of the atmosphere. It is composed mostly of thinly distributed hydrogen and helium, the lightest gases. There is some atomic oxygen near the bottom of the exosphere, which is called the exobase. In the exosphere, satellites can orbit the Earth with little atmospheric drag.</p> <p>There is no clear boundary between the exosphere and space.</p> | <p><b>WHAT PEOPLE SHOULD KNOW</b></p> <p>"One of the reasons I study the atmosphere is because it's critical to life. But it's a very, very thin veneer on the surface of the planet. You can go anywhere in the world and take an air sample in what you think is the cleanest place on earth, and it's full of human-produced compounds. We can see all these things that were never there before in the history of the planet. And we can measure it. And so the stuff that people dump into the atmosphere doesn't disappear, doesn't escape to space. And this is relevant for the greenhouse effect, it's relevant for stratospheric ozone depletion, it's relevant for just air pollution in general."</p> <p>— Robert Rhow, geochemist, UC Berkeley</p> | <p><b>SPACE JUNK + CO<sub>2</sub></b></p> <p>In 2012, the Swiss Space Center announced plans to launch CleanSpace One, a robot spacecraft that will grab inactive satellite parts and bring them back to Earth.</p> <p>"Research since the early 1990s has led to the suggestion that increasing carbon-dioxide emissions, from power stations and other terrestrial sources, are increasing the orbital lifetimes of defunct satellites and debris in the lower-altitude orbits. Observations and modeling support the theory that CO<sub>2</sub> emissions have led to a cooling of the thermosphere (at altitudes between 85 and 600 km) and a consequent reduction in density, which reduces the frictional effect on orbiting objects. The hypothesis is that thermospheric cooling could continue for the next hundred years, despite CO<sub>2</sub> emission controls, by which time the effect would be comparable with that of solar variability."</p> <p>—Mark Williamson, Space: The Fragile Frontier</p> | <p><b>SATELLITES</b></p> <p>"Investigate satellites, learn their names, who owns them, what they do, how they have been used. **CERTIFICATE OF CUSTODIANSHIP**  
FOR THE PRESERVATION OF  
*Tree Mountain – a Living Time Capsule*  
10,000 Trees. 10,000 People. 400 Years

*As part of humanity's commitment to the future well-being of the ecological, social and cultural life of the planet Earth, let it be known that a tree;*

numbered, **1993** **1985** *was planted by or for:*

on **TREE MOUNTAINS** in *Yläjärvi, Finland*

A massive earthwork and land reclamation project conceived by environmental artist Agnès Denes, *Tree Mountain* is a living work of art that upholds the highest ideals of humanity in a public affirmation of its future. Its design is a mathematically spiraling forest incorporating the golden section and sunflower/pumpkin patterns with 10,000 trees planted by people from all over the world. A huge man-made mountain measuring 420 meters long, 270 meters wide, 20 meters high and oval in shape. *Tree Mountain* is a work of environmental art and bioremediation project that restores the land from resource extraction use to one in harmony with nature. It is protected land to be maintained for the centuries to come.

*Tree Mountain* is part of *Strata Project* in collaboration with the municipality of Yläjärvi, the Finnish Ministry of the Environment, the artist and the landlady. It is sponsored by the United Nations Environment Programme.

This Certificate of Preservation is to evidence the solemn purpose and undertaking of the person or persons whose name or names are inscribed above, and who shall hereafter be known as *Custodians of Tree Mountain*, who are joint partners in a free and open-ended enterprise for the preservation of *Tree Mountain* and its trees which will bear their name and their respective heirs and descendants for the centuries to come, to keep *Tree Mountain* undisturbed, protected, free and open, as a gift to all of the people of the Earth, in perpetuity, and to name the *Custodian's* names and those of their heirs to be appropriately memorialized and maintained together with the names of all other *Custodians of Tree Mountain*.

International in scope and unparalleled in duration, *Tree Mountain* is an undertaking dedicated to benefit future generations with a meaningful legacy.

In witness whereof, this Certificate of Preservation has been created and delivered on behalf of the Government of Finland by the Municipality of Yläjärvi by its duly authorized representative as of the 11th day of June, 1998.






